

TONGUE INTERACTION WITH ORGANS

Stoll considered that Cranial nerves V, VII, IX, and X are all sources of innervation to the tongue and that the tongue can become the seat of referred pain from a distant source of irritation in any organ innervated by these nerves. **However**, neither he nor Goodheart or Walther considered that treating the tongue could reciprocally relieve the above organs.

Goodheart, Walther and others found general postural interactions with the jaw muscles and joints and other muscles and joints, but no specific interactions.
